Focus Areas

- Improving tax administration to reduce the burden of paying taxes while increasing revenue collection.
- Facilitating trade by reducing the time and cost of moving goods across borders.
- Implementing high-impact regulatory reforms to improve the business environment.
- Increasing awareness among key stakeholders of the reform process, objectives, and results through strategic communications and increased publicprivate dialogue.



Trade Facilitation

Trade Facilitation: Overview of Objectives

- Improve the current legal framework for trade
- Increase transparency in application of trade and customs regulations
- Reduce time and cost of moving goods across borders and increase the volume of trade
- Foster improved dialogue between Customs, other trade regulating agencies, and the trade.

- Support Moldova Customs Service to introduce improved risk management techniques focused on compliance and reducing controls at the point of clearance
 - Adopt a strategic risk management plan with specific targets; monthly performance reviews
 - ➤ Blue Lane introduced August 2015 to move more shipments into post-clearance control and speed the clearance process
 - Introduce improved analytical techniques to enhance risk profiling and targeting
 - ➤ Training in AEO pre-audit techniques; pre-audit guidance for Customs and the Trade in line with EU/int'l norms.

- Streamline the import-export process by introducing EU simplified procedures
 - Developed the legal basis for simplified procedures
 - Support IT upgrades to implement simplified procedures
 - Promoting adoption of duty deferment with guarantees, initially for AEOs
 - Streamline selected customs regimes inward processing, temporary admission, outward processing, warehousing, etc. and align them with EU standards
 - Develop internal procedures for customs officers
 - Assist MCS in implementing the procedure on reduced number of SAD supporting documents

- Introducing full paperless processing E-Customs
 - Developed the legal basis for paperless processing
 - ➤ Assist Customs to increase use of E-declarations (currently 40% for e-Export and 7% for e-Import)
 - Support IT upgrades to improve paperless processing
 - Develop and implement communications strategies for promoting e-Customs – focus is on ease of use, savings in time and cost, reducing direct contact with customs officers

- Moving toward a Single Window environment
 - ➤ Inventory all trade-related (non-tariff) regulations, their legal basis and their application in practice
 - Support Customs in inter-agency committee to review all non-tariff trade regulations and assign to HS codes
 - Recommend streamlining and eliminating unnecessary, duplicative, and outdated restrictions, e.g. agency overlap
 - Update the integrated tariff of Moldova (TARIM) to incorporate all tariff and non-tariff requirements with full legal force. Align TARIM with EU TARIC
 - Promote TARIM as a trade facilitation tool

- Promoting improved communications among Customs and the trade.
 - Ongoing support to the National Customs Consultative Committee.
 - Supported concept and design of new Customs web site.
 - Developed printed and web-based outreach materials on simplifications; how-to guides for trade.
 - ➤ Supported regional outreach efforts, e.g. nine seminars on Customs simplifications held in September/October 2015.
 - Surveys of the trade to solicit opinions and gauge level of impact.

Trade Facilitation: Looking Forward – June 2016

- Support Moldova Customs to meet its obligations under the EU-Moldova Association Agreement and take full advantage of the DCFTA.
- Achieve full electronic (paperless) processing of customs declarations, supporting documents for all customs regimes, and other customs documents.
- Support Customs to upgrade ASYCUDA
- Fully implement EU simplified procedures for AEOs
- Achieve duty delay with guarantees, initially for AEOs.
