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
OPERATIONAL RESULTS 2016

The transshipment of cargo via Giurgiulesti International Free Port increased by 4% reaching 876,274 tons in 2016. The transshipment of bulk cargo via Giurgiulesti International Free Port increased by 3%, reaching 757.977 tons and the transshipment of cargo in sea containers increased by 10% reaching 118,299 tons in 2016. About 57% of the bulk cargo transshipments volumes consisted of the export of Moldovan grain, oil seeds and vegetable oil and about 34% of the import of mineral oil products. Grain, oil seeds and vegetable oil were primarily delivered by maritime vessels from Giurgiulesti to European Union countries located in the Mediterranean area. Mineral oil products were mostly delivered to Giurgiulesti by maritime vessels from the Black Sea and the Mediterranean as well as by river barges and via the European railway network from Romania. Apart from the export of agricultural goods and the import oil products, Giurgiulesti International Free Port is also frequently used for the import of construction material, soda ash, coal, pet-coke and agricultural machinery.




CONTAINER TRANSSHIPMENTS

The total number of sea containers transshipped via Giurgiulesti International Free Port (GIFP) and delivered to/collected from the Port of Constanta by Danube Logistics SRL increased by 3% to 8,200 containers in 2016. While the number of import containers decreased due to the challenging economic environment. the number of sea containers used for the export of Moldovan grain, wine, spirits, vegetable oil and other goods increased by 25%. The main destinations of these export containers shipped from Giurgiulesti were Malaysia (32%), Myanmar (22%), Indonesia (13%), USA (5%) and China (4%). The shipments of containers were realized in collaboration with MSC. CMA, CSCL, COSCO, ZIM, ARKAS, APL and other leading container shipping lines calling on a weekly basis on the port of Constanta.



Thomas Moser, the Chairman of Danube Logistics SRL stated: "We are very pleased about the considerable increase in the export of Moldovan goods in sea containers. Last year we managed to facilitate Moldovan exports to 43 countries."



TRANS CARGO TERMINAL MORE THAN DOUBLES THE CAPACITY OF ITS GRAIN EXPORT TERMINAL AT GIURGIULESTI INTERNATIONAL FREE PORT



On November 10, 2016 Trans Cargo Terminal SRL, a subsidiary of Trans-Oil Group (TOG), celebrated the completion of its grain export terminal expansion project at Giurgiulesti International Free Port. As a result, Trans Cargo Terminal is now able to load more than 1,000 tons of grain per hour onto maritime vessels of up to 8,000 tons, as well as river barges - the fastest loading rate of any grain terminal in the region.

Vaja Jhashi, President of TOG stated: "Due to the substantial increase of our capacity we will be able to attract new clients and at the same time enable our group of companies and our existing clients to increase the transshipment volumes. The expansion project consisted of the construction of an additional berth on the Danube, the erection of a silo with a storage capacity of 12,000 tons, a brand new deep water jetty as well as the installation of high-capacity loading equipment. In total about USD 6m were invested for the realization of this project, which has created 30 additional permanent jobs. The expanded

facility has a total grain storage capacity of 70,000 tons and increased the transshipment capacity from 300,000 tons to 800,000 tons per annum, which is equivalent to about 75% of the Republic of Moldova's annual grain exports."

Thomas Moser, the director of Danube Logistics SRL – operator of Giurgiulesti International Free Port: "We congratulate Trans Cargo Terminal for the successful expansion of their grain terminal. The increased capacity ensures that from now on the majority of Moldova's grain exports can be shipped directly from Moldova to international markets".



In addition to the export of grains in bulk, which are mostly delivered to the markets in the Mediterranean region, significant quantities of Moldovan grain are exported via Giurgiulesti International Free Port in sea containers to Asia. During the first 10 months of 2016, eleven Moldovan companies have shipped more than 60,000 tons of wheat in sea containers from Giurgiulesti to such countries as Malaysia, Myanmar and Indonesia.

DANUBE LOGISTICS INTENSIFIES COOPERATION WITH THE STATE RAILWAY OF MOLDOVA



The State Railway of Moldova (CFM) and Danube Logistics SRL, the general investor and operator of Giurgiulesti International Free Port, reached the an agreement on regular transportation of containers between sea Giurgiulesti International Free Port (GIFP) and Chisinau railway station. On 1st of August the first 40 containers were delivered from GIFP to Chisinau by railway in order to facilitate the export of grain in sea containers to South-East Asia.

Initially the Giurgiulesti – Chisinau container transportation service is envisaged to be weekly. The block train reaches the destination in approximately 12 hours. In order to simplify logistics and for convenience of exporters/

importers Danube Logistics decided to establish a depot for empty sea containers at Chisinau railway stations.

The railway transportation of containers from/to GIFP is an effective alternative to road transportation, especially during the summer when stringent restrictions for the movement of trucks apply.



DANUBE LOGISTICS SRL CARRIED OUT FOR THE FIRST TIME THE TRANSSHIPMENT OF COAL AT THE PREMISES OF GIURGIULESTI INTERNATIONAL FREE PORT

In December 2016 Danube Logistics carried out for the first time coal transshipment at the premises of Giurgiulesti International Free Port. The total amount of 3,000 tons was transshipped within several days from river barges onto trucks and railway wagons. Danube Logistics, the general investor and opera-



tor of Giurgiulesti International Free Port (GIFP) always strive to wider its operational portfolio by attracting new clients and increasing its transshipment volumes. With the direct access to international waters on the maritime section of the river Danube, its access to the broad- and narrow-gauge railway systems as well as its location directly on the border with Romania and Ukraine, GIFP continues to develop as an important logistics hub for Moldova and the region.

OIL PRODUCTS ORIGINATING FROM SLOVAKIA TRANSSHIPED FOR THE FIRST TIME VIA GIURGIULESTI INTERNATIONAL FREE PORT (GIFP)


In December 2016 Danube Logistics, general investor and operator of GIFP, carried out the transshipment of approximately 1.200 tons of gasoline from a river barge to the Oil Terminal located within GIFP bounds. The same amount of gasoline is expected to be delivered to GIFP in cisterns via railway in the end of January. The gasoline made it on along the Danube River to Giurgiulesti International Free Port from the SLOVNAFT Refinery located near Bratislava. SLOVNAFT, a.s., based in



Bratislava is refinery with annual processing capacity of 5.5 – 6 million tons. The company core business is production, warehousing, wholesale and retail sales and distribution. SAFETY GUIDELINES AND GOOD INDUSTRY PRACTICES FOR OIL TERMINALS



From 2011 till 2015 Danube Logistics has been strongly involved in a project on 'hazard and crisis management' in the Danube Delta. This project, with the focus on the safety of oil terminals, was carried out within the framework of the Convention on the Transboundary Effects of Industrial Accidents of the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe (UNECE). In 2015 a successful full-scale field exercise was held at the premises of the Giurgiulesti International Free Port. The project and the exercise lead to important conclusions and recommendations where Danube Logistics, but also authorities from Moldova, Romania and Ukraine benefit from. Many recommendations are included in the work and action plan on HSE of the company to further enhance the safety at the terminal.

The HSE officer of Danube Logistics was invited to present the results of the project during a meeting of the Conference of the Parties of the UNECE Industrial Accidents Convention in November 2016 in Ljubljana, Slovenia. About 40 countries as Parties to the Convention participated in this important meeting. The presentation was well received and Danube Logistics was congratulated for the active involvement in the project, expertise on the matter and the willingness to make the terminal available for the important exercise.
